2010-2011 Annual Report

Highlights

- The Literacy Council of Buncombe County (LCBC) was awarded a three-year Melvin R. Lane Fund grant totaling \$150,000 to build and strengthen fundraising and outreach efforts. This grant helped bring all employees to full-time hours.
- Our Adult Ed. program doubled the on-going training opportunities available to tutors by
 offering more in-service trainings and referring tutors to local workshops and
 conferences.
- Our Adult Ed. director redesigned the tutor training manual to incorporate the NC Adult Basic Education Content Standards, as well as address all five components of researchbased reading instruction (phonemic awareness, phonics, fluency, vocabulary and comprehension).
- LCBC launched the Augustine Project, serving children for the first time. Thirteen tutors participated in the 60-hour intensive phonics-based training and 100% rated the training as excellent. They tutored low-income children struggling with basic literacy skills at eight sites throughout the year. The children who had at least 40 tutoring sessions and were eligible for post-testing increased their phonemic awareness an average of 1.3 grade levels and increased their sight-word reading by 22% and comprehension by 42%.
- Our ESOL program increased the number of students served, average instructional hours and number of students completing an educational level.
- Our ESOL program is offering 11 additional small-group classes throughout the community in churches, community centers, workplaces and schools.
- Our Development office planned the 4th Annual Authors for Literacy Dinner & Silent Auction featuring Ron Rash, which exceeded goal in funds raised and achieved the highest attendance yet with 266 guests.
- LCBC increased individual giving by nearly 25%, involved 35 local and national businesses as Corporate Partners, and enlarged our non-governmental grants program.
- LCBC participated in a sustainability project to develop strategies for continued success and future viability.
- Our Outreach office engaged 71 first-time donors, which is 85% over goal.
- The e-newsletter was re-designed and strengthened, following a consistent bi-monthly format.
- Our outreach office made presentations to 23 groups, at 12 events and fairs and in 12 one-on-one meetings.
